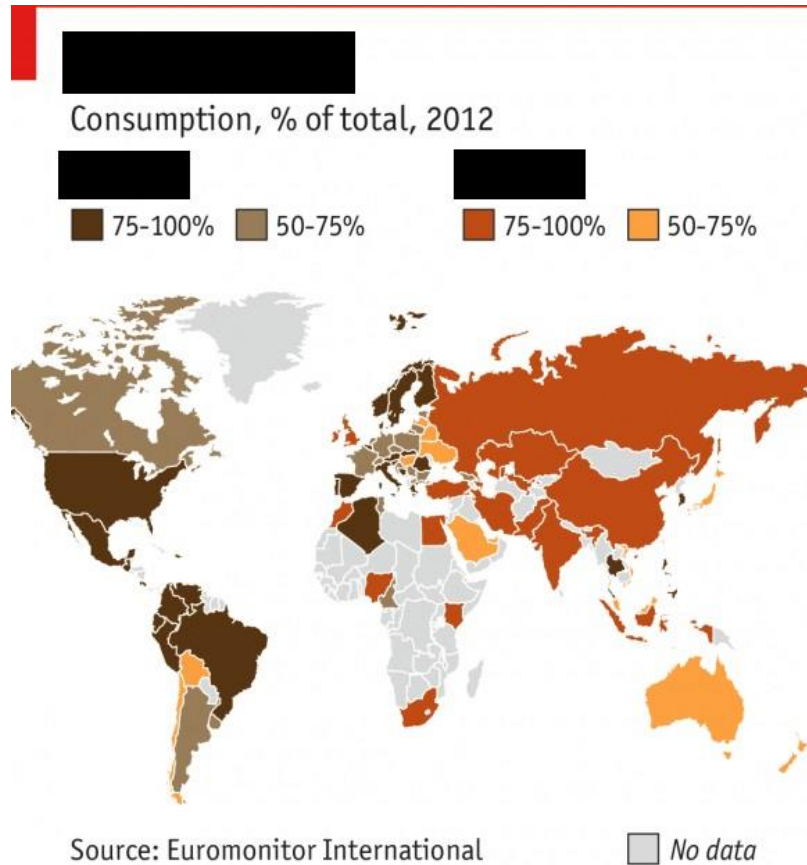

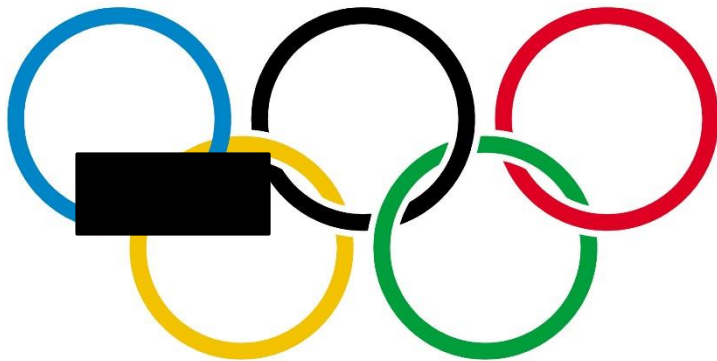


The map shows usage of 2 types of beverages across the world. What kind of beverages? *Corresponding colour should be in the answer*

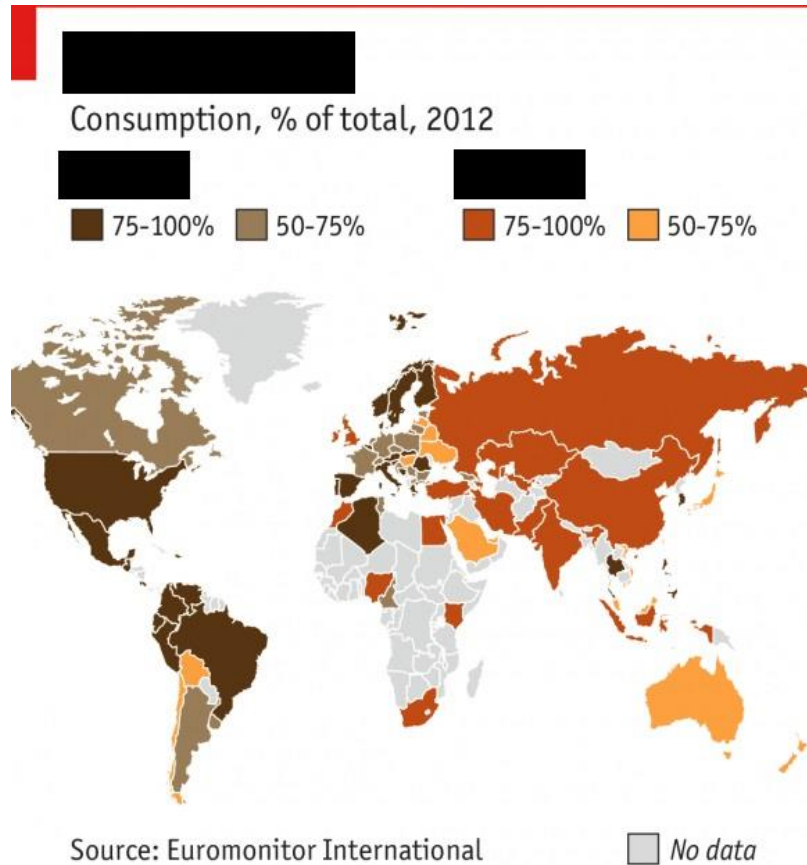

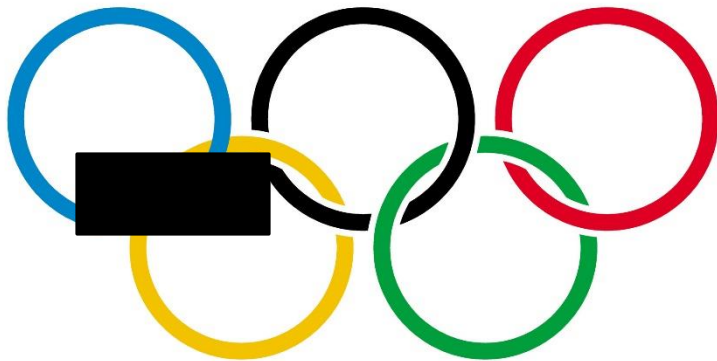
